We have been a part of a myriad of events and celebrations this term!



Healthy Planet Library and Imagination Studio



The entire month of June this year, we curated an experiential world tour for our children as part of our *Around the World Summer Programme*. The children had an enchanting experience creating art, listening to stories, exploring literacy, and gaining an introduction to country specific cultures and practices. A few of the areas touched upon were: *Northern lights*; Hieroglyphic name art; Mosaic art; Yayoi Kusama and Frida Kahlo inspired art; *Great Barrier Reef*; Dutch, French and Japanese language lessons; *NBA and FIFA*; *Amazon rainforests*; and British and American Literature.

On account of *Doctors' Day,* July began with a fun-filled informative session conducted by our member parent Dr. Noopur who, after the read aloud *Llama Llama, Doctors are here to help*, graced our children with reasons why doctors should not be feared.



Following a read-aloud of *Charlie and Lola: Look After Your Planet*, our children tried the process of making their own recycled paper and then moulded it into a small cup. The overall experience fostered virtues of empathy and care for one another and our planet.

In August, Lionel Messi's incredible career and achievements sparked excitement among the children. Following the story, a fun and challenging football quiz tested their knowledge of the sport and its stars, and they moved with high spirits to an obstacle course where they tackled a drill designed to improve their football skills. They dribbled through paths, navigated agility challenges, and took their best shots at the goalpost. Laughter and cheers filled the courtyard as the children enjoyed the hands-on experience, learning and having fun all at once.

Our recent *Narrative Writing Workshop* for children was a transformative experience. Young participants learned storytelling through memory webs and personal photos, making the process engaging and enjoyable. The first two sessions introduced key storytelling elements like character development, plot structure, and setting. Interactive activities helped children blend their memories and imagination into compelling narratives. Using personal photos as prompts added an emotional connection to their stories. As the workshop progressed, group discussions and peer reviews created a collaborative learning environment. The final session culminated in a showcase where each child presented their narrative, celebrating creativity and hard work.

We enjoyed a magical celebration of *Taylor Swift* including a readaloud of a book on the superstar. Then our *Swifties* fearlessly conquered the stage in their 'blingiest' outfits for a round of *Karaoke* in their best party attire!

With nature in full bloom in our gardens, we transformed one day into an exciting naturalist exploration experience for our members. The event kicked off with a delightful read-aloud session focused on gardens and bugs, sparking curiosity and wonder in our young explorers. Following a scavenger hunt in the *Butterfly Garden*, our budding naturalists formed small teams to build *bug hotels*—cosy shelters where insects can stay during the monsoons. These *bug hotels* provide a unique opportunity for



the children to observe the insects over time, fostering a deeper connection with nature.

On National Handloom Day, the read-aloud of Sadiq Wants to Stitch was a delightful success! The children were deeply absorbed by the story and eager to dive into the loom weaving activities. Our member parent, Ms. Saloni organised and led the interactive weaving activities that greatly enhanced the children's learning. They enthusiastically practised weaving with strips of paper, grasping the concepts of warp and weft. The experience was further enriched as they used magnifying glasses

to explore different fabrics and see the weaving process up close. Additionally, the children enjoyed an art activity where they used blocks to create vibrant prints with paint on paper.

On *Grandparents' Day*, our school and library were filled with the joy and warmth that only grandparents can bring. We gathered together to read stories, share laughter, and enjoy the precious moments created by the presence of different generations. To celebrate this special relationship and the priceless wisdom, stories, legends, and myths passed down from one generation to the next, we invited our grandparents to accompany their grandchildren to the library to connect over delightfully timeless tales found in *Amar Chitra Katha* graphic books. Following this,, everybody sowed a little sapling to take home. We wrapped up the event with a relaxing tea and coffee session at the *Café*, providing a perfect setting for everyone to unwind and share their experiences.





One rainy afternoon, children gathered eagerly for a read-aloud session featuring *Maisy Goes on a Plane* by Lucy Cousins. As the story unfolded, their eyes sparkled with excitement, imagining Maisy's adventures. After the reading, the fun continued when a practical experience: a role-play airport was set up. The courtyard buzzed with energy as the children turned into passengers and interacted with the pilot and airport staff. They navigated through security, checked their boarding passes, and 'boarded' their flights, fully immersing themselves in the playful world of travel!

Our *Independence Day* event was designed to help our young readers uncover the rich history of our great nation. We organised an age-appropriate, interactive session that delved into India's struggle for independence, making history come alive for our curious minds. Mr. Akash Banerjee, a parent and esteemed member of our community, was present as a history expert to answer the children's questions and share his insights into our nation's past.

Tips for happy children!



(Thank you dear Suhaana, aged 3 years, for your picture of Sakshi Ma'am!)

Children love painting, drawing and making joyful pictures and simple 3 dimensional structures that hold meaning for them.

 For those of our little ones who do not speak yet, offering them the opportunities to show their inner 'voices' through creation is important!

Having a dedicated space where your children can access a range of things themselves and make their own kind of art whenever they wish to, makes them feel good and it also benefits their fine motor skills and literacy development at the same time. Art making is a wonderful way for all children to express their feelings and ideas freely.





Find a cosy and permanent carpet- free place in their bedrooms or a place in your house, make the table suitable for a child's height, add a small chair and little baskets of the following kinds of materials to make it even more inviting:

- A glue stick,
- Some wooden ice cream sticks
- Wide/'fat' crayons for young children's hands
- A tray of water-colour paints and a water pot,
- A thick and thin paint brush,
- A pot of playdough and some playdough tools
- Some small pieces of coloured and different textured papers,
- Some A4 paper, cut into different shapes remember, we do not always need to paint or draw on rectangular shapes!

Useful notes:

*Child-sized scissors can be nearby but would always require your supervision when used.

*Sequins, buttons and assorted other shiny things can add a sparkle to their creations, but again, must only be used under adult supervision.

*Do not forget to have a basket of natural materials like leaves, little shells, pebbles etc. available, that your child has perhaps collected on trips to the park, beach or your garden etc. Again, supervision is important when small elements are being used by your young one.

Important:

*Ready - made/photocopied or colouring book style drawings to 'colour in' do not count as art! True art is something that is completely invented and created by the children themselves.

*Do not be surprised if your little one is unable to tell you about or explain their creations! It is the **process** and **enjoyment** of making the art that matters the most and should always be encouraged and celebrated!


