

Tips for happy and safe children!



Greeting little ones as they arrive in the mornings, we see several children sitting without seat belts on their parents' laps in the car's front seat. We also see many children arriving at school standing in front of the passenger seat unattached, leaning for support on the car dashboard with their faces near the windscreen, with nothing to hold them back in case of sudden braking or stopping. Often, parents say, "But we live very nearby" or "He/she does not like to wear a belt" in response to our concerns about safety.

We all want our children to be happy and have fun, but sometimes boundaries must be set with love for their own well-being and security, even if it means a temper tantrum! The consequences of not sitting safely might even mean you are obliged to cancel an outing, turn the car around, and return home or pull to the side of the road and wait patiently until your little one agrees to sit securely, but maintaining your stand is surely worth it.



- The best kind of support is a child-adapted car seat set in the middle of the back seat. These seats can be made fun with a basket of toys next to it and a teddy bear or two.
 - Books to look at can be an addition, but be aware that looking very closely at print and the pictures in a book may make a child feel motion-sick.
- If a 'child-adapted car seat' is not available, an alternative is to ensure an adult is sitting next to the child in the back seat, with both wearing seat belts at all times.
 - Journeys can also be made more enjoyable with children's songs or instrumental music playing at a peaceful volume.
- You can also play games as a family, such as... "*Can you tell me what you can see*?" Or for older children, *"I spy with my little eye, something beginning with...."* (when playing this game, give your child the letter sound rather than the letter name as a clue.)
