Keynote sessions by Professor Haeny Yoon and Professor Tran Nguyen Templeton from Columbia University, New York and Dr. Swati Popat Vats, President of the Early Childhood Association, India, along with interactive discussions, offered deep insights into enriching learning environments, early brain development, and the transformative power of play, language, and imagination. Healthy Planet Founders, Dr. Arunabh Singh and Dr. Suhasini Kanwar, shared their thoughts on the future of early childhood learning and the research being conducted by the Learning Lab at the school.







Attended by over 120 educators, The Festival of Learning was a nourishing experience and reinforced the power of collaboration and the shared commitment to shaping meaningful learning experiences for young minds.

Illustration Workshop with Guest Illustrator Suvidha Mistry


